
#### Saint Nicholas Cabasilas

Saint Nicholas Cabasilas was born in 1322 A.D. in Thessaloniki. Very little is known about his life, but he is remembered through two texts he wrote: The Life in Christ and The Exposition of the Divine Liturgy. Both of these have become fundamental readings for Orthodox Christians. The first, The Life in Christ, is a detailed look at what being a Christian is. He of course states that as believers in God, we are not actually Christians unless we enter into a relationship with our heavenly Father. This is through the mysteries of the Church and full participation in what Christ offers us through His body, the Church. The book goes through each sacrament and describes the transformative power of each one. We are not Christians, we are not in relationship with Jesus Christ, we are

not saved, unless we participate in the Life of Christ, the Church services and sacraments. The Commentary on the Divine Liturgy is a shorter read on the meaning and significance of each part of Liturgy. Many of us worship each Sunday without knowing the reason we do many things. This is a simple step-by-step explanantion of all aspects of the liturgy beginning with the priestly prayers before it starts.

He lived at the same time as Saint Gregory Palamas (see 11/14 and the 2nd Sunday of Great Lent) and was an ally of his during the Hesychastic Controversy on Mount Athos in the 14th century. This controversy was so important and big that it is often described as the 8th or 9th ecumenical council clarifying that we can come to know God in this earthly life through his energies or activities.

#### Άγιος Νικόλαος ο Καβάσιλας



Ο Άγιος Νικόλαος ο Καβάσιλας, γεννήθηκε στη Θεσσαλονίκη το 1322

μ.Χ. και ήταν ανεψιός του Νείλου Καβάσιλα, ο οποίος χρημάτισε Αρχιεπίσκοπος Θεσσαλονίκης. Το πατρικό του επώνυμο ήταν Χαμαετός, κράτησε όμως το μητρικό επώνυμο Καβάσιλας προφανώς λόγω της ισχυρής παρουσίας του Θείου του. Έκανε λαμπρές σπουδές ρητορικής, Θεολογίας, φιλοσοφίας και φυσικών επιστημών στη Θεσσαλονίκη και την Κωνσταντινούπολη. Για ένα διάστημα διετέλεσε σύμβουλος του Κατακουζινού ο οποίος στα τελευταία χρόνια της ζωής του, εκάρη μοναχός και διέμενε στην περιώνυμη Μονή των Μαγγάνων.

Ο Άγιος ασπάσθηκε τις απόψεις και ιδέες του Γρηγορίου Παλαμά για τον ανατολικό μυστικισμό και το ησυχαστικό πνεύμα. Υπήρξε πολυγραφότατος και πληθωρικός συγγραφέας αξιολογότατων Θεολογικών, ερμηνευτικών, λειτουργικών, ασκητικών και διδακτικών έργων, ως και περίφημων πανηγυρικών λόγων, επιστολών, επιγραμμάτων και κειμένων πολιτικού και κοινωνικού περιεχομένου. Μετά από πολλές περιπέτειες για τις απόψεις του περί ορθοδόξου μοναχισμού και δη κατά των Βαρλαάμ και Ακινδύνου, εκοιμήθη ειρηνικά λίγο μετά το 1391 μ.Χ.. Η Αγιοκατάταξη του έγινε στις 19 Ιουλίου του 1983 μ.Χ.

#### The Gospel According to John 7:37-52; 8:12

On the last day of the feast, the great day, Jesus stood up and proclaimed, "If any one thirst, let him come to me and drink. He who believes in me, as the scripture has said, 'Out of his heart shall flow rivers of living water." Now this he said about the Spirit, which those who believed in him were to receive; for as yet the Spirit had not been given, because Jesus was not yet glorified.

the Spirit had not been given, because Jesus was not yet glorified. When they heard these words, some of the people said, "This is really the prophet." Others said, "This is the Christ." But some said, "Is the Christ to come from Galilee? Has not the scripture said that the Christ is descended from David, and comes from Bethlehem, the village where David was?" So there was a division among the people over him. Some of them wanted to arrest him, but no one laid hands on him. The officers then went back to the chief priests and Pharisees, who said to them, "Why did you not bring him?" The officers answered, "No man ever spoke like this man!" The Pharisees answered them, "Are you led astray, you also? Have any of the authorities or of the Pharisees believed in him? But this crowd, who do not know the law, are accursed." Nikodemos, who had gone to him before, and who was one of them, said to them, "Does our law judge a man without first giving him a hearing and learning what he does?" They replied, "Are you from Galilee too? Search and you will see that no prophet is to rise from Galilee." Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I am the light of the world; he who follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."





#### Archangel Michael Greek Language Institute 2021-2022 School Year

Dear Parents,

Welcome to the Archangel Michael Greek Language Institute. The mission of the Archangel Michael Greek Language Institute is to offer children of Greek descent an opportunity to experience and embrace the Hellenic Christian culture. The primary goal is to enable students to understand, speak, read, and write the Modern Greek language and to expand their knowledge and appreciation of Hellenic history, culture, and dance.

We plan to have a fun, safe, and academically viable environment for your child during the school year. To ensure a successful year, we would like you to read the following guidelines before registering.

1. Every child attending the Greek Language Institute must have a current registration form, submitted through our online program. Parents are responsible for ensuring that the information on file is current and accurate. Registration fees are due upon registration to secure a spot in the school. \*Non-refundable Fee of \$100 per child (to be applied towards the total tuition amount).

2. The Greek Language Institute is a prepaid program. Full payment is due prior to the first day of classes. Payments will only be accepted via our electronic system. Please do not send payments to the church office or the Greek school office. If this poses a problem, kindly reach out to administration to resolve. All previous outstanding balances need to be paid prior to registering. Our current tuition rates are:

1 <sup>st</sup> Child Enrolled	\$700 + \$100 (registration fee) = \$800
2 <sup>nd</sup> Child Enrolled	650 + 100 (registration fee) = $750$
3 <sup>rd</sup> Child Enrolled	650 + 100 (registration fee) = $750$
7 <sup>th</sup> Grade Enrollment	650 + 100 (registration fee) = $750$
8 <sup>th</sup> Grade/Regents Prep Class	\$625+ 100 (registration fee) = \$725
Teen Conversation & Culture	\$600 +\$100 (registration fee) = \$700
Modern Greek for Adults	\$600 +\$100 (registration fee) = \$700

#### \*Regents Class and 7<sup>th</sup> grade meet only once a week, and students in these classes are not considered as 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, or 3<sup>rd</sup> child.

3. While we make every effort to accommodate schedule requests, please know that our classes do fill up quickly, and placement will be provided on a first come, first served basis. The following days/sessions will be available for the coming year:

\*Please note that each adult and teen class must have a minimum of 5 students to run. If the enrollment falls below the minimum, that particular class will be canceled and refunds will be given.

4. The Greek School is a service that is provided by our Church. The Parish Council requires a minimum of \$650 Stewardship Commitment from all families attending the Greek School. This charge helps to defray the cost of maintaining the Greek School Facility. Anyone who wishes to donate more is welcome and encouraged to do so. You must have a Stewardship form completed by the Church Office prior to registering for Greek School. If this presents a hardship to your family, please speak to Father John.

5. A one time PTA due of \$50 per family is required at the time of registration. Our PTA organization plans fun and exciting events for the children to help enhance their experience in school and offers enrichment opportunities throughout the year.

6. A book fee of \$50 per child is included on the electronic form and collected before classes begin. This money will be used to purchase all necessary books and learning materials to be used in the classroom.

7. A \$5 Youth Protection fee is automatically added to every registration, ensuring that all of our staff members and any adults present in the building have completed the program. (Go to our link on the AMC Website)
