The Sign of the Holy Cross

When we consider the sign of the Holy Cross, we often simply think of what we have inherited, but as discussed last week, this sign was prefigured and shown for centuries before the actual Passion and Crucifixion of our Lord. The Lord gave us many of these throughout the Old Testament and even in the rest of the world. Our God is the God of all people so within different cultures elements of our True Lord, Jesus Christ is seen. This is sometimes most evident in the sign of the Cross. The Greeks had it in the shape that Prometheus was tied down and the Chinese have the cross which means perfection or ten. With all of this background considered, God since time eternal has intended to direct our gaze towards the Cross and the Life-saving work of Jesus. However, we marginalize Him and all that He did. We say all Gods are the same or that all religions lead to the same destination. Really, we all are made by the same God and we are His beautiful creatures, but we have been given one path, that of the Lord Jesus Christ and His Cross. The last example we will leave off with is the sign that is shown through Moses in the Israelites' victory over the Amelakites. The Jews came across a foreign enemy while they were still traveling in the desert and they were engaged in battle. When

Moses realized they were losing, which was not typical, the Lord instructed him to extend his arms out over the battlefield and the Jews began to win. This of course made the sign of the Cross. Whenever Moses' arms would get tired they would begin to lose again. And so two younger men went on either side to hold his arms extended. They were Aaron and Or. Of course, in Greek this was spelled with Alpha and Omega. The Cross is our beginning and our end; our salvation.

Τὸ Σημεῖο τοῦ Σταυροῦ

Ο σταυρός, λέει ὁ ἱερὸς Χρυσόστομος, «ἀνεῖλε τὴν ἁμαρτίαν, καθάρσιον τῆς οἰκουμένης ἐγένετο, καταλλαγὴ χρονίας ἔχθρας, ἀνέωξε τοῦ οὐρανοῦ τὰς πύλας, τοὺς μισουμένους φίλους ἐποίησεν,

είς τὸν οὐρανὸν ἐπανήγαγεν, ἐν δεξιᾶ τοῦ θρόνου ἐκάθισε τὴν ἡμετέραν φύσιν, μυρία ἕτερα παρέσγεν ἡμῖν άγαθά». Έτσι έξηγεῖται γιατὶ ἡ πεποίθηση τὧν χριστιανὧν θεωρεῖ τὸν τίμιο Σταυρὸ «θέλημα τοῦ Πατρός, δόξα τοῦ Μονογενοῦς, ἀγαλλίαμα τοῦ Πνεύματος, κόσμημα τῶν ἀγγέλων, ἀσφάλεια τῆς Ἐκκλησίας, καύχημα τοῦ Παύλου, τεῖχος τὧν ἁγίων, φῶς ὅλης της οἰκουμένης». Παρόλο ὅτι στὴν ἐποχή μας φαίνεται πως «ή τοῦ κόσμου σοφία τὰ πρωτεῖα φέρεται, παρωσαμένη τὸ καύχημα τοῦ σταυροῦ», ἐντούτοις θὰ συμφωνήσουμε ἀπόλυτα μὲ τὴ διαπίστωση ἔγκυρου θεολόγου ποὺ ἔγραψε: «Ἀπὸ ὅλους τους θησαυροὺς ποὺ ἀνωρύχθηκαν ἀπὸ τὰ σπλάγχνα τῆς γῆς ἢ θὰ ἀνορυχθοῦν στὸ μέλλον, δὲν ὑπάρχει ἀσφαλῶς πιὸ πολύτιμος ἀπὸ τὸν Σταυρὸ τοῦ Κυρίου, ποὺ ἡ ἀγία αὐτοκράτειρα Ἑλένη ἀνέσυρε στὸ ψῶς τοῦ ἡλίου. Ὁ Σταυρὸς εἶναι τὸ καύχημα τὴκ χριστιανοσύνης. Τὸ πανάκριβο κόσμημα ποὺ ἔλαβε σὰν δῶρο καὶ σὰν ἀπόδειξη τῆς ἀγάπης του ἀπὸ τὸν θεῖο Νυμφίο της ἡ Ἐκκλησία... Αὐτὸ τὸ σύμβολο τῆς ἀτιμώσεως καὶ τῆς καταδίκης, ποὺ προκαλοῦσε φρίκη στοὺς ἀρχαίους λαούς, ἀπέβη, μὲ τὸν θάνατο τοῦ Σωτῆρος πάνω του, ἡ πηγὴ τῆς χαρᾶς, τῆς δυνάμεων καὶ τῆς δόξης. Έγινε τὸ κλειδί, μὲ τὸ ὁποῖο ὁ ἐξωσμένος Ἀδὰμ ξανάνοιξε τὶς πύλες τῆς Ἐδέμ... Τὸ πανίσχυρο ὅπλο, μὲ τὸ ὁποῖο κατατροπώνονται οἱ δυνάμεις τοῦ κακοῦ. Τὸ κατάρτι, πάνω στὸ ὁποῖο ίσαρίσθηκε σὰν πανὶ ή περγαμηνή τοῦ Εὐαγγελίου, γιὰ νὰ γίνει κατορθωτὸς ὁ πλοῦς τῆς ἀνθρωπότητος πρὸς τὸ λιμάνι τῆς ἄνω ζωῆς... Ὁ Σταυρός, ἡ ὡραιότης τῆς Ἐκκλησίας, Ὁπως τὸν ἀποκαλεῖ ἕνα τροπάριο, ἂς γίνει ή όμορφιὰ τῆς ζωῆς τοῦ καθενός μας. Αὐτὸς πράγματι εἶναι ἡ ὕλη, ποὺ πάνω της συνέθεσε ἡ θεία ἀγάπη τὸ άριστούργημα τῆς ἀπολυτρώσεως. Χωρὶς αὐτὸν εἶναι ἀδύνατο νὰ τὸ κάνει δικό του ὁ καθένας».

Apolytikion of the Feast of the Cross Save, O Lord, Your people and bless Your inheritance, grant victory to the faithful against the adversaries of the faith and protect your people, by the power of Your Cross.

Kontakion of the Memorial

Remember, O Lord, as You are good, Your servant(s), and forgive every sin he (she, they) have committed in this life. For no one is sinless except You, Who have power to grant rest to those who have fallen asleep.

Cause our faithful emperors to be glad in Your power, granting them the victories against their adversaries. And for an ally, Lord, may they have You, peace as their armor, the trophy invincible.

St. Paul's Letter to the Galatians 2:16-20

Brethren, knowing that a man is not justified by works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Christ Jesus, in order to be justified by faith in Christ, and not by works of the law, because by works of the law shall no one be justified. But if, in our endeavor to be justified in Christ, we ourselves were found to be sinners, is Christ then an agent of sin? Certainly not! But if I build up again those things which I tore down, then I prove myself a transgressor. For I through the law died to the law, that I might live to God. I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me; and the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me.

The Gospel According to Mark 8:34-38; 9:1


